

Greek Group Lessons

Level A2



PREREQUISITE

The student is expected to have the ability to understand and use everyday expressions familiar to him, as well as how to use a few very basic phrases aimed at serving specific needs. He/she must be able to introduce himself and other people and ask and answer questions about personal details such as where he/she is from, describe the people he/she knows and talk about his / her belongings. He/she must be able to talk in a simple way, provided that his / her interlocutor speaks slowly and clearly and is willing to help.

The student must be able to exchange information about himself and his / her relatives, respond to everyday needs (buying goods, ordering or asking for information about services), creating and maintaining social and professional contacts (recommendations, invitations, entertainment). The student at this level must be able to communicate primarily verbally, mainly in interpersonal situations, but also in those situations requiring the use of the telephone.

In addition, when necessary, he/she must be able to understand the details of texts written in very simple and clear language, and in the same way, he/she should be able to express himself/herself in writing.
